Raul Ayala, MD



Dr. Ayala was named president of the California Academy of Family Physicians (CAFP) in 2023. His decade-long commitment to rural patient care initiatives, including mobile care clinics and virtual care for homeless communities, reflects his belief in accessible healthcare for all. He was recognized by the National Organization of State Offices of Rural Health in 2020 for his significant contributions to rural healthcare.

Ronald Chambers, MD, FAAFP



Dr. Chambers is the DIO and program director for the Dignity Health Methodist Family Medicine residency program and chair of the family medicine department, chief of South Sacramento Hill Physicians, medical director for Mercy Medical Safe Haven Clinic, and physician advisor for the Dignity Health Human Trafficking Response. He is deeply passionate about human trafficking survivor care. Emphasizing trauma-informed and victim-centered approaches, he developed "Medical Safe Havens."

Benjamin Doolittle, MD, MDIV



Dr. Doolittle is program director for the combined internal medicine-pediatrics residency program and the medical director of the Faculty-Resident Continuity Clinic. His medical practice focuses on addiction, Hepatitis C, HIV, and primary care. His research delves into the convergence of medicine and spirituality, and wellness and burnout. He is an ordained minister, holding a Master of Divinity from Yale Divinity School.

Yuman Fong, MD



Dr. Fong holds the Sangiacomo Family Chair in Surgical Oncology and chairs the department of surgery at City of Hope. He is an expert in liver and pancreas cancers and is leading the deployment of robotic surgery. He has written over 1,000 scholarly articles and 22 textbooks. He is an elected member of both the American Institute of Medical and Biological Engineering and the National Academy of Medicine.

Dr. Lau was the only pediatric cardiac electrophysiologist in Alabama for 25 years. He is a professor of pediatrics at University of Alabama at Birmingham, department vice chair for clinical affairs, division director of pediatric cardiology, and president-elect of the medical staff at Children's of Alabama. He helped found Alabama Lifestart, an organization which has deployed AEDs in public schools throughout the state.

Dr. McKinney is the senior associate dean of graduate medical education and a distinguished professor of interventional radiology at Mayo Clinic College of Medicine and Science in Jacksonville, Florida. He currently serves as the national chair of the ACGME Radiology Review Committee. His clinical practice is integrated with nationally recognized liver transplant and cancer programs at Mayo Clinic.

Yutaka Niihara '86, MPH



Dr. Niihara has dedicated a significant portion of his career to patient care and research within the realm of sickle cell disease. He is the founder of Emmaus Life Sciences, Inc., and a pivotal figure in the creation of Endari, an FDA-approved L-glutamine therapy for sickle cell disease, sanctioned in July 2017. He left in August 2023 to establish Niihari International, Inc., which focuses on sickle cell patients in India, Africa, and the Middle East.





One of the weekend's highlights is the APC Gala, where the Alumni Association will recognize its Honored Alumni and the Alumn of the Year. Entertainment for the evening will include medical student musical talent and video stories.



To celebrate its 100th Anniversary, the Alumni Association set a goal to raise 100 *Paying It Forward* Scholarships by the Annual Postgraduate Convention (APC) in 2024. The *Paying It Forward* Scholarship is a covenant gift of 50% tuition and fees (\$33,000 for 2023–24) for a junior or senior medical student for one or two academic years aimed at tangibly reducing student debt.

Students apply for the scholarship and are selected by the Loma Linda University School of Medicine Dean's Office. To sustain this scholarship program, students awarded agree to "pay forward" the amount they receive to the program within 25 years.
